Swanland Pond Partnership (SPP)

This year's drought caused extremely low water levels in the pond. As the water receded, the airline for the aeration system had to be lengthened to reach the deeper water! The system has worked well to oxygenate the water, keeping our fish and other aquatic life healthy.



Recent rain has helped the water levels recover but this has also triggered an algal bloom and poor water quality. Algal blooms often smell musty—they turn the water green and can look like paint on the surface as they form scums. The Parish Council have put up warning posters advising people and their pets to stay away from the water as some algal blooms can be harmful on contact. Harm increases for people and pets if the water is swallowed.



The SPP and Parish Council are looking at options to clear the silt and reeds from our three lagoons. Routine management of the reed root beds, in addition to the annual cutting of the reeds, is also being discussed as we need to ensure that invasive reeds and marginal plants do not grow in unwanted areas. Management of the reed beds using machinery, manpower and/or herbicide control are all being explored. The Conservation Volunteer organisation (TCV) in Hull has been contacted to see if they can help us clear the lagoons.

In May, it was a privilege for SPP members to meet, and talk with, Year 2 pupils and staff from Swanland School. Over two days sixty-six pupils visited in small groups to see and learn more about the aquatic life that lives in the pond. Our first brood of moorhen chicks were a particular favourite as well as some of the “mini-beasts” that the SPP had collected.

Litter Picking

Firstly, and most importantly, a **big ‘thank you’** to all the villagers who turned up to help in the recent whole village litter-picking day. This was the final village litter pick for this year. It is lovely to see some families taking part. The Spring litter pick will be on **Saturday 11 March 2023**.

It is also heartening to see unsung volunteers who litter pick on their way to school, as they walk the dog, go to the local shop or visit the park. I dread to think what our streets and hedges would be like without them. So, a gentle reminder, - please take your litter home or use the bins provided. I am often complimented on how litter free and clean the centre of the village is. This is thanks to the litter picking team who give up their time to litter-pick the village centre on a weekly basis.

Finally the staff of ‘Omya’ collected litter as part of World Earth Day from the hedgerows and verges around the ‘Omya’ quarry site. This was greatly appreciated.

If you have any doubts about a message, contact the organisation/person directly. Don’t use the numbers or address in the message – use the details from their official website/other reliable sources. Remember, banks (or any other official source) will never ask you to supply personal information via email.

Forward suspicious emails to **report@phishing.gov.uk**; forward texts to **7726**. Even if you're not certain they're a scam, this can be checked.




Swanland Tennis Club


